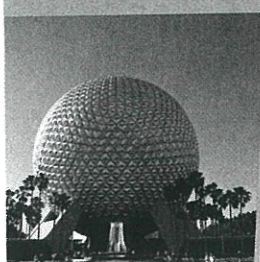

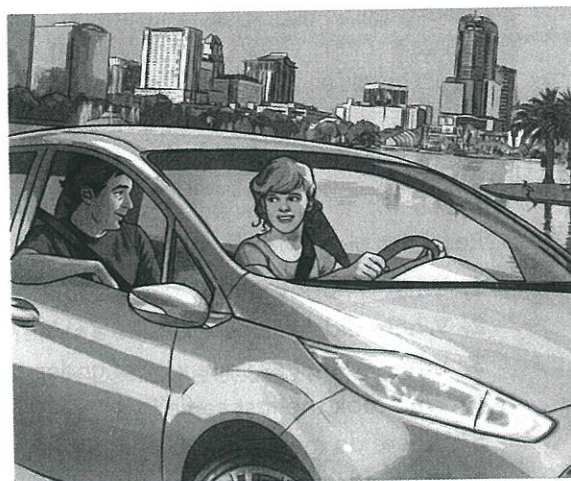

The present perfect is formed with the verb **have** + the past participle.

Have you **been** to a jazz club?

Yes, I've **been** to several.

No, I **haven't been** to one.

Has Carlos **visited** the theme parks?

Yes, he's **visited** three or four.

No, he **hasn't visited** any parks.

Have they **eaten** dinner yet?

Yes, they've **already eaten**.

No, they **haven't eaten** yet.

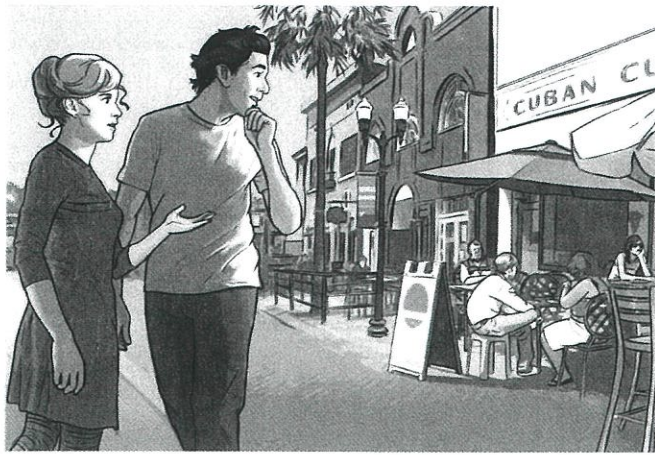

Have you ever seen an alligator? Yes, I have. I've seen a few alligators in my life. No, I haven't. I've never seen one.

I saw a big alligator at the new park last week. I didn't go to the alligator park last week, so I didn't see any.

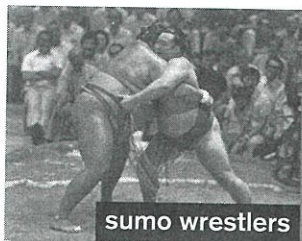

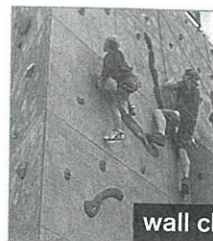
